

MANY ITALIANS LEAVE.

About 75 Have Left the Soo to Take Part in the War With Turkey.

In conversation with a prominent Italian last evening he stated that, in his opinion, some 75 representatives of the nation had left the Sault during the past two weeks to take a hand in the war with Turkey. A contingent of 50 left the Sault about two weeks ago, since which time parties of three and four have been leaving each week.

The Italian referred to was very much interested in the war, and not being able to read English asked the Star man to read the latest reports from a paper which he had touching on the war. When informed that the Turkey had practically surrounded Tripoli he was considerably distressed, but was of the opinion that Italy's navy, which he claimed was stronger and more efficient than was generally supposed would eventually terminate the war in Italy's favor. He believed further that the sympathy of the nations of Europe, and in fact the whole civilized world, was with Italy. He expressed the belief that the war now being waged would result in another war between Italy and Germany, and had every confidence that Italy could hold her own if such a crisis came about.
