Interesting Meeting of the  
Officers Was Held Last  
Evening.

ARMORY GUARANTEED  
BY MR. A. C. BOYCE

Provisional School of Instruc-  
tion to be Opened to  
Assist Officers.

"The Soo Rifles" was the name de-  
cided on for the city regiment at last  
night's meeting, and the regiment will  
be numbered the "51st."

In an address to the officers, Mr. A.  
C. Boyce, M.P., who is honorary colon-  
el of the regiment, said that it would  
be gazetted in a few days, and that  
the department had guaranteed an  
armory for the Sault although when  
work would be started on the armory  
had not been announced yet. He also  
said that a provisional school of in-  
struction to permit the proposed offi-  
cers to qualify for their positions  
would be commenced at an early date.

There will be eight companies in  
the regiment following the recommen-  
dation of the department, and the offi-  
cers have been chosen. Other speak-  
ers were Mr. S. L. Penhorwood, Mr. P.  
T. Rowland, Alderman Campbell, Mr.  
G. H. Hayward, and Mr. F. J. Buchan-  
an, who are all active officers of the  
regiment.
