

WARNED RESERVISTS

Ambassador to America Tells Austrians to be Ready.

MANCHESTER, Mass., July 27.—On Sunday, Dr. Constantine Theodore Dumba, ambassador from Austria-Hungary, ordered all Austrian consuls in this country and Canada to inform all Austrian-Hungarian reservists in the country to prepare to return to their native land in the event of war with Serbia.—Dr. Dumba reiterated his remarks of Saturday, during the course of which he declared that war was imminent.

"I expect," said Dr. Dumba, "to receive warning at any moment how that war has practically been declared. When it comes I shall order all my countrymen up to the age of 42 years, in this country, to prepare to return to Austria. Notices to this effect will be published in the different newspapers in this country, in our several languages. At present I think there are in the United States and Canada 200,000 Austrians and Hungarians.

"All that I have heard to date is that Serbia's reply to our demands was unsatisfactory and that diplomatic relations had been severed. The only question of importance now is whether or not Russia will come to the aid of the Serbs and thus involve all Europe in a general war."
