

SHOULD NOT GO TO WAR AND LEAVE WIVES TO STARVE

Interpreter Chopowik Gave Impressive Warning to Ukrainians at City Hall To-day.

"You should not go back to the Old Country to fight and leave your wives and families here to suffer," was the consensus of the ultimatum delivered by the Interpreter Chopowik to the unemployed at the city hall this morning.

Chopowik stated that although the Ukrainians are for the most part of Slavonic origin, or considered so at the present time, they should not return to their native land to fight against their blood-brothers.

"The Austrian consul in Montreal will send these men to their homes for the purpose of engaging in war, should war be declared," said Chopowik, "but I am a Canadian and many of these men are Canadians, consequently they should not engage in the imminent war at all."

Fifty-four of the employed Ukrainians will be deported Thursday and about sixty-five more will be deported also by way of Montreal on Friday. They will sail on ships of the various lines that brought them into Canada and will go to Montreal from here at the expense of whatever railway company brought them to this city.

Many of the erstwhile unemployed are being sent to the "bush," by the various lumber employment agencies, and Messrs. D. A. Martin and company are shipping men out at the rate of about 80 daily now. They figure that they will have placed about 1,500 men when all demands are filled.
