

# CALLING HOME THE AUSTRIAN RESERVE

## Proclamation Issued at New York. No Summons for Servians.

NEW YORK, July 20.—A proclamation calling upon all patriotic Austrians, Hungarians and Croatians to forward their addresses to their nearest consulate has been forwarded for publication to all pro-Austrian-Hungarian newspapers throughout America by Charles Winter, who is charge of the Austro-Hungarian consulate in this city. This is taken as an indication that a partial mobilization of Austrian forces has been ordered. The proclamation contains the amnesty proposal announced on Tuesday.

At the consulate today it was said that returns were expected to be received this week from all Austrian subjects who have received special or individual calls to arms. These reservists, it was said, would be the first to be sent over, then will come the others who have answered the general mobilization call.

### NO CALL FROM SERVIA.

No official word has as yet been received at the Servian consulate here concerning mobilization calls. This was accounted for by the fact that all cable messages from Servia must come through Italy and Austria and therefore may have been stopped in transit.

Thus far the war clouds overhanging all Europe have not affected the bookings for European ports, nor is it believed that many bookings have been cancelled on account of it. About 400 Austrians and Servians sailed yesterday on the La Savoie among them being Count Karolyi, leader of the Hungarian independent party.

Cable advices from London and Paris made public here today indicated that the thousands of American tourists were awaiting developments before continuing trips eastward.
