

MANY RELIEF CASES.**Over Seven Hundred Received Help From
City in July.**

City Relief Officer Coyell's report for July shows that 768 cases were dealt with during the month, and 727 of these received relief. Applicants numbered 381 males and 387 females. Out of 620 applications for admission to homes from 299 males and 321 females, 597 were approved. Eight males and one female were sent to infants' homes. Out of 81 applicants, 67 were given assistance. Twenty-three persons were **deported**, 15 males and 8 females.

ENGLISHMAN AND LAW.

Mr. W. A. Jarvis was fined \$10 in the Police Court yesterday for speeding his automobile at the rate of twenty-five miles an hour. Mr. Jarvis explained that he had just arrived from London, England, where such speeding was allowed on deserted streets. The Magistrate pointed out that he was obliged to follow the letter of the law, which forbade automobiles to proceed at a pace over fifteen miles an hour. On leaving the box Mr. Jarvis expressed a desire to get hold of the makers of these inane laws.
