

WRECK OFFICE OF AUSTRIAN CONSUL HERE

A crowd attacked the Austrian consulate in the Keewayden building last night. Two big plate glass windows at the Austrian consulate were broken. W. Luckes, the consul, appealed to Lieutenant-Governor Cameron today for protection, and the governor has issued an order for the protection of all foreign consulates.

"I have received no instructions from the Austrian government since the war broke out," Mr. Luckes declared today. "As a matter of fact there has not yet been any declaration of war between England and Austria. The attack on our offices was a disgraceful affair under the circumstances. If it had taken place during office hours I would probably have been injured, as a large piece of scantling which was thrown through the window hit on my desk. I expect to remain at my post here until war is declared between Austria and Great Britain."

The Belgian consul received a cable from Brussels this morning stating that all deserters from the army would be forgiven if they volunteered for service in the present war.

The Netherlands consul has a large party of reservists ready to leave at any moment.
