

CANADIAN TRADE IN GERMANY IS BROKEN

Dominion Government Adopts Same Decree as the British Authorities.

Canada's trade relations with Germany are at an end. There is to be no more exporting of our products thither and no importing from Germany. The same imperial decree which Great Britain has put in force was adopted by the Canadian government last night and promulgated in an extra of the Canada Gazette. Canada is not to apply to or obtain from Germany any merchandise whatever, nor is it to contract to do so or to carry goods between. The prohibition is absolute.

Another order in council prohibits the export to any country outside of the Empire of arms, ammunition, projectiles, powder, explosives and camp equipment.

A third prohibition, but one which under present conditions is not likely to cause much inconvenience or embarrassment precludes Canadians from subscribing to any loan raised by Germany.
