

51st REGIMENT MADE SPLENDID SHOWING

Called out for the regular Tuesday night parade last evening the members of the 51st Soo Rifles, some 400 strong, formed up at the armouries and led by the band proceeded to the ship canal, where the guard was changed and arrangements made for the further companies which would be on duty there. The parade was witnessed by a large number of citizens who complimented the regiment upon its splendid showing.

From now on the several companies will undergo a course of drill at the armouries from eight to nine o'clock each evening. Col. Penhorwood made this announcement at the armouries following the parade last night. It is important that every member of the regiment attend.

During the past few days a large number of recruits have applied for membership in the 51st, and it is apparent that instead of lessening the ardour of Canadians insofar as chances of active service are concerned, the situation has resulted in many desirable young men coming forward and enlisting who would not otherwise have done so.

The complete list of those who have volunteered for active service abroad will not be made known until after the medical inspection at Quebec. This order has been received at the Sault armouries from the Minister of Militia.

Col. Penhorwood informed the Daily Star this afternoon that the final lists of those who have volunteered for service abroad will be made up and forwarded to the proper authorities today.
