

CODE MESSAGES .

FOR THE GERMANS

Being Sent from Sayville Station in Spite of the President's Order.

Ottawa, Aug. 14.—The wireless telegraph apparatus recently brought from Petawawa camp and placed on top of the militia department building is tapping German sources of information. Before the plant was erected on the militia building, the militia department was informed by a Toronto university professor who has given long study to aerial communication, that code messages were being sent from the United States wireless station at Sayville, Long Island, to Carthagena, Colombia, and thence to the Carolina Islands in the Southern Pacific which are owned by Germany. The matter was taken up by Sir Robert Borden with President Wilson with the result that the United States president prohibited the acceptance of code messages at the Long Island station. This morning, however, the wireless operator on the militia building discovered that a German code message via Carthagena was received at Long Island. The matter will be taken up again with President Wilson, with the object of having code messages from Germany kept out.
