

ALLEGED DYNAMITER IS REMANDED

Claims He Crossed River in Order To Get Some Window Casings

LETHBRIDGE, Aug. 23.—Henry Weirmeir, the suspect arrested in connection with the supposed attempt to blow up the C. P. R. viaduct here on August 17, as he emerged from the river near the bridge and adjoint to the deserted shack in which 23 kegs of stolen blasting powder were found, was remanded for trial today on a charge of carrying burglar's tools.

Weirmeir was released on \$500 bail and \$500 surely voluntarily offered by himself. It is thought by the police here that he had no connection with the powder or the bridge. He claims to have crossed the river to get some window casings from the deserted shack.

A packing case opener was found on his person.
