

# 8,000 OF THE ENEMY'S RESERVISTS ROUNDED UP

## SPECIAL CAMP AT JOHANNESBURG FOR THOSE TAKEN IN SOUTH AFRICA.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Cape Town, Aug. 31.—The process of rounding up Austrian and German reservists from the different parts of the Union of South Africa and holding them as prisoners of war has been proceeding for a fortnight. Some 8,000 of them are now detained in a special camp at Johannesburg.

Prince Salm-Salm and several other officers have been given special quarters in Bloemfontein. Prince Salm-Salm is a Captain in the Prussian cavalry.
