

MANY ITALIANS ARE DEPARTING FOR THE HOME LAND NOW

Eleven Left the City Yesterday, and Fifty-Five Will Leave on Sunday.

Mr. William Grassi, the local Italian consul, yesterday sent off a party of eleven Italians bound for the home land, and expects that another party of fifty-five will leave on Sunday. This is part of the usual fall exodus, though the number is larger than is generally the case on account of the lack of work this fall. Some of these Italians are army reservists, but it is not the war that is taking them home now, as the Italian reserves have not been called out. A few, of course, are heading for Europe because they believe there is a likelihood of Italy being engaged in the general conflict shortly.
