

# *Montreal Man Was Condemned as Spy*

## *Intervention of American Consul Saved Him From Being Shot*

Montreal, Oct. 1.—How a Montrealer, J. T. Armand, was arrested in Germany at the outbreak of the war, sentenced to death as a spy, and saved by the intervention of an American consul was related to the Chamber of Commerce here yesterday.

Mr. J. T. Armand had concluded business in Paris and was visiting friends in Alsace when war was declared. He was arrested and the fact that he had letters in French upon him was taken as evidence that he was a spy. He was ordered to be shot, but got an American consul to explain matters just in time.

Mr. Armand is still a prisoner and in writing to his wife, who resides at Anhuntsic, Que., gave accounts from German sources of British and French disasters.
