

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY RESERVIST TAKEN PRISONER HERE TO-DAY.

The immigration department at the Grand Trunk station this forenoon found it necessary to impede a mysterious looking foreigner who was en route from Chicago to Watertown. The man, who had about \$15 in his possession, and carried a quantity of bag-

gage, declared he was a Russian on his way home. His manner betrayed the lie on his tongue, so his baggage and papers were searched. He thereupon burst into tears and confessed he was a Hungarian named Michael Lenyo, who had served three years in

the army of his native country and had since for eight years been a reservist. The Austrian legation authorities at Chicago had commanded him to mobilize, and an order to that effect was found among his papers. The poor fellow was evidently greatly distressed by fear that his not reaching his destination would be a calamity for him. However, he was necessarily conducted to the armoury and placed there with other prisoners of war.
