

ANGRY HERR. KALTSCHMIDT

Herr Kaltschmidt, indicted in Essex County on the charge of conspiring to blow up factories and public buildings in Canada is a German after the Kaisers' own heart. Interviewed by a Detroit News representative, he hurls defiance at the British and Dominion Governments with shrapnel conversation that covers the world and its effect is about as deadly as would be an explosion of his beloved bologna.

"My credit has been damaged \$200,000 perhaps"—"My Government will see that Canada pays"—"I married and raised my family here, but I am a German citizen"—"I am armed, I carry a nail file and a hunting knife"—"I hold the British Government in contempt." These are a few of the more or less fiery utterances of this spotlight poser.

But the gentleman from Marine City whose offence warranted an indictment is a student of history—"as she is wrote" in Germany. He

sticks the British under the fifth rib with these verbal stilettoes.

"Great Britain has seen fit to invalidate pacts"; "Attempted to assassinate Sir Roger Casement"; "Placed in concentration camps 250,000 farmers induced to come to Canada"; "Destroyed a 701 year-old mission in India"; "Confiscated the property of merchants in East India"; Systematized a world-wide campaign of lies."

Great Britain dignified "a scrap of paper" into one of the world's greatest documents, while Germany defamed it; Great Britain protects its citizens fully against such as Kaltschmidt; Great Britain's acts, in India are approved in India if not in Marine City; Great Britain has told the truth to its own people and to the world; Great Britain can raise a billion dollars in the United States to-morrow—Germany could not raise five millions four months ago. Great Britain is fortunate in its critics.
