

Exhibition Park is A Formidable Camp

*Nearly All the Buildings in
Use; Indoor Ranges Are
Provided*

The Exhibition directors are heartily co-operating with the military authorities in making the Exhibition buildings as comfortable as possible for the Mississauga Horse, who are quartered on the grounds. All of the buildings have been placed at the disposal of the men, with the exception of the Industrial and Manufacturers' Buildings. As these contain permanent fixtures, the cost of clearing them and replacing the fixtures next year would be too great. There is an abundance of room, however, without them.

For sleeping accommodation the soldiers are using the Poultry, Horticultural and Government Buildings. The general staff is quartered in the Administration Building. The Press Bureau is being used as officers' quarters, while the W.C.T.U. hall, under the Government Building, serves as an excellent mess room.

During fine weather, the men will do their rifle practice out-of-doors, but for wet weather indoor ranges have been set up in the space under the Grand Stand. The big 300 foot Transportation Building makes a splendid armouries in which to drill during stormy weather. The other buildings are being used for the storing of supplies, etc.
