

MOUNTED POLICE TO ENFORCE ORDER ON ALIEN ENEMIES

Strict Surveillance of All Aus- trians and Germans in Canada

OTTAWA, Oct. 22.—A stricter surveillance of Austrians and Germans living in Canada is being undertaken as a result of the bomb outrage in Montreal. The order has been given in England to arrest all alien enemies. Shortly after the war broke out an order was passed ordering all alien enemies to surrender their firearms by September 15. This order has not been very rigidly enforced, but the Dominion police in the east and the North West Mounted police in the west will now strictly enforce this order. In places where there are settlements of Austrians and Germans not naturalized Canadians search will likely be made. There are now slightly over 600 prisoners of war in Canada.

The largest number are confined at Fort Henry, Kingston, others are at Halifax, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Lethbridge, Victoria and several other points. In addition, some two thousand prisoners have been let out on parole and have to report to the authorities at stated intervals.
