

Respa, Dynamiter, In Secret Prison

Plot to Free Enemy Discovered in Time; Had Used Saw

Windsor, Ont., Oct. 22.—Members of the Detroit "Bomb bund," of which Albert Kaltschmidt, a wealthy manufacturer, is the leader, are said to be responsible for the hatching of the latest plot, recently uncovered, to liberate Charles Respa, German reservist, held on three charges of conspiracy and dynamiting buildings in Windsor and Walkerville.

Spirited from the Sandwich jail by Governor John Marmon shortly after the discovery of the plot to free him, the present whereabouts of Respa remain a secret.

The cell formerly occupied by Respa is on the east side of the jail, and the prisoner frequently hung his coat over the bars, presumably to keep out the sun while he slept.

It was discovered yesterday that the man took this means to cover up

his operations, and had sawed through the bars of the cell; the saw has been found.

Olga Schmidt, the pretty daughter of a man now interned in Kingston for complicity in the wrecking of the Nipigon Bridge, is alleged to have smuggled the saw into the jail in a basket of fruit and food she recently took to Respa, who is her uncle. She lives in Detroit.

The dismissal of the turnkey, who was supposed to examine the contents of all baskets, has been announced.
