MORE AUSTRIANS TAKEN.

At Windsor Over Fifty Have Been Arrested; These Three Had \$500.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, Oct. 23.—Three Austrians with railway tickets and boat tickets to Europe, were taken off a Grand Trunk train here last night and turned over to the military authorities as prisoners of war. They will be held at the Windsor armory for a few days and will later be taken to Kingston prison until the war is over. They had \$500 between them. More than fifty foreigners have been arrested in Windsor since the outbreak of the war.

BELGIAN REFUGEES MOVE.

Amsterdam, Oct. 25. —Up to yesterday about 17,000 Belgian refugees passed through Roosendaal, Holland, on their way back to Antwerp, according to The Handelsblad.
