

COMPLETES PLAN OF REGISTERING ALIENS

Mounted Police Will Look After Bulk of the Work

INTERNING FOREIGNERS

Sir William Otter Likely to be in Charge of the Scheme

Ottawa, Nov. 2.—Arrangements are being completed to-day by the Cabinet for the registration of all alien enemies in Canada. Chief Carpenter, Inspector of Dominion Police, has already been appointed registrar at Montreal, and it is expected the other registrars will be named to-day. Col. Sam Steele will likely take personal charge of the work in Winnipeg, and Commissioner Perry of the Royal Northwest Mounted Police in Regina. The work in Calgary and Edmonton will be in the hands of the Mounted Police.

In addition to the places where it was decided to establish registration offices at Saturday's Council meeting three additional offices will likely be opened in Ontario. Only two have so far been named, at Ottawa and Fort William. It is likely an office will be opened in Toronto, another some place in the Niagara peninsula, probably St. Catharines, and a third at Sault Ste. Marie or Sudbury for New Ontario.

Only in Large Centres

While the registry offices will be opened only at centres where there is a large alien population, this does not mean that the smaller places will be overlooked. Dominion police will be sent out to any smaller points where there is a colony of alien enemies. In the West also the mounted police will undertake registration of Austrians and Germans in all smaller places and throughout the country.

The appointment of General Sir William Otter to take charge of the work of internment of all prisoners of war will likely be made to-day. General Otter is in Ottawa and has had a number of conferences with Hon. C. J. Doherty, Minister of Justice, and Hon. J. D. Hasen, acting Minister of Militia. He has been asked to take charge and it is understood has accepted. General Otter, Col. Fleet, Hon. Mr. Doherty and Mr. E. L. Newcombe, Deputy Minister of Justice, had a long conference on Saturday when the best methods of confining any prisoners were discussed. One plan which was seriously discussed was to set the prisoners at work clearing and cutting wood in the Dominion parks. However, there has been some objection to this scheme. Some plan, however, it is understood, is being worked out and an announcement will be made shortly.
