

A Big Party Reached Here From Brantford.

The 150 Turks arrested in Brantford on the order of the Dominion police, and lodged in the armories there, were transferred, on Thursday, to Fort Henry, Kingston, to be interned.

The Turks arrived at Toronto at 12.15 and left again at 1.30, reaching here at 8 p.m. They were accommodated in three cars and guarded by thirty men of the 35th regiment under Capt. Robert Sager. The cars were drawn into a siding at the east end of Toronto depot and were left standing there while food that had been brought from Brantford was supplied to the men. The guards stood by with fixed bayonets, one man at the end of each coach, and four inside. Some of the Turks spoke good English, and not a few of them are naturalized British subjects. The Turkish colony at Brantford consists of about 400 individuals, and many of these arrested were in good positions in civil life.
