

RIFLE ASSOCIATION NOW 500 IN HAMILTON

Thirty Prominent Business Men Joined Yesterday

**Market Clerk Demands Retraction by
Ald. Coo—Two More Turks Arrested—Death of Patrick Ronan, Veteran Separate School Trustee.**

Hamilton, Nov. 13.—Some thirty prominent business men enrolled in the Hamilton Rifle Association at a meeting held in the Board of Trade to-night, bringing the total up to 500. Sir John M. Gibson and Lieut.-Col. Acheson, commander of the association, gave addresses pointing out the necessity for such organization. Regret was expressed that the city had not given a grant.

Nine Turks Now Detained.

Two more Turks were arrested at 47 Princess street this evening, by Constables Bell and Hayes. They had just arrived from Dundas. This makes nine Turks arrested by the local police in the past forty-eight hours.

Barton Sewerage and Water Supply.

The civic Works Committee and the Barton Township Councillors met this afternoon to consider Barton's application for an extension of the city sewerage and water systems into the township on the Mountain. The engineers and solicitors were instructed to see if they could not reach some basis of agreement.

Patrick Ronan's Death.

Patrick Ronan, who had been in the flour and feed business here for more than fifty years, died this morning. He was a devout Roman Catholic, and for forty years he was a member of the Separate School Board. In politics he was a stalwart Liberal. The funeral will take place from 218 Cannon street east, Monday morning.
