

POLICE CONFISCATE VARIED COLLECTION OF GERMAN RELICS

Dum-Dum Bullets Among Ex- hibits Taken by Chief Hill's Men.

A helmet, a sword and ammunition of many kinds, even including samples of the renowned dum-dum bullets, comprised an added decoration to the office of Chief of Police Hill this morning. The exhibits have been confiscated by the police and are reported to be the property of a former officer of note in the German army. Who this officer is and where the goods were taken from, was information the police wished suppressed this morning by reason of the fact that the case is still under investigation, with an arrest expected at any moment.

The helmet is one of those of the pattern frequently worn by the Kaiser, while the sword is three feet of deathly looking steel; the ammunition forms a varied collection.

What meaning is conveyed in the find could not be told by Chief Hill today. "We have yet to conduct an investigation," he said.

The fact, however, remains that the owner of the goods, no matter for what purpose he had them in his possession, was committing an offense in retaining them after the order in council of September 3 had been issued to the effect that all weapons, military uniforms, etc., previously in the possession of aliens, was to be delivered either to a justice of the peace or to police authorities.
