

CANADIANS WITH GERMAN NAMES WERE ARRESTED

Members of the Contingent Who Bore Teutonic Patronyms Were Examined.

Toronto, Nov. 25.—Writing from Salisbury Plain under date of November 7th, the *Globe's* staff correspondent said:

"There was a sensation in the Canadian camp to-day when orders came from the war office that every Canadian volunteer with a German name was to be placed under arrest and examined. Practically every unit in the contingent was affected, and scores of men with German names had been apprehended and taken to headquarters, where they now await the next move of the authorities. It is probable that they will be taken to a concentration camp. The unfortunate feature of the whole affair is that there are many among the prisoners who fought with the British in South Africa and in other parts of the world. There are several in the company who had medals pinned on their breasts by the late Queen Victoria, and one of these wept bitterly when he was taken from the ranks."
