

Goes to Trial On Charge Of Treason

Toronto, Nov. 25.—On a charge of high treason against the empire, Paul Mazur, a young Canadian corporal in the Canadian militia, born of Austrian parents, was sent up from the police court to the assizes for trial to-day.

W. K. Murphy, jr., his counsel, put up the plea that the young fellow was going to visit in the United States, and did not deliberately attempt to smuggle three Austrians out of Canada. An interesting feature of the case is that Mazur was acting as a government interpreter in enrolling the alien enemies at Port Hope.
