

NINE ASSYRIAN TURK PRIESTS DEPORTED

Have Been Canvassing Toronto
for Funds to Relieve the
Christians in Turkey.

The nine Assyrian-Turk priests, who have been canvassing Toronto for funds to relieve the Christians in Turkey, all pleaded guilty in the Police Court to-day, to a charge of vagrancy, as they have no credentials and no written permission to collect. Furthermore they are alien enemies, being Turks. They were remanded for sentence on condition that they would at once leave the country. Detectives escorted them to the train.

Herbert Rogers, 16 years old, convicted on two charges of house-breaking, was remanded a week, and given to the Salvation Army, who will give the lad a chance.

Robert Brown, who shot and wounded his wife and a boarder last week, was remanded to Thursday on charges of attempted murder.

Roy Whitman, William Goodman, Gordon Dyson, and Roland Lee, all implicated in extensive robberies of plumbing in vacant houses, were remanded a week.

Two years in Portsmouth Penitentiary was the sentence given to George Bagley, an old offender, for stealing a coat from Sadie Slatkin.

Tony Gentelli, and Tony Copitosti, broke into Nobol's tailor shop, 31 Edward street, and also into a tobacconists, at 226 Chestnut street, and were arrested by Detective Koster on their return from Hamilton. Copitosti got 90 days, Gentelli, 30 days, and both will be **deported**.

George Peters got 90 days in jail for an indecent assault.
