

ARRANGEMENTS TO EMPLOY THE PRISONERS OF WAR

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Ottawa, Dec. 13.—The two thousand or so German and Austrian prisoners of war in Canada will be moved this week to their respective work at Petawawa and in clearing land for experimental farm purposes along the line of the National Transcontinental Railway in Ontario and Quebec. Arrangements are now being made for supplies of warm winter clothing.

In Ontario the experimental farm to be cleared will be in the vicinity of Hearst, on the N. T. R. In Quebec from 400 to 500 men will be set at work near Parent in building a 40-mile road through the bush to connect with the roads to the south.

The men in the camp will be under military discipline, but the Government has no desire to treat the prisoners as active enemies of the country, and they will be given all the consideration comfortable with adequate discipline under the circumstances. A small wage will be paid.

OBJECTIVE OF \$10,000.

Markham Township Council Asks County to Take Over Belgian Fund.

Unionville, Dec. 13. — At a meeting of the Markham Township Council a resolution was passed that the Belgian Relief Fund be taken over by the county. An objective of \$10,000 was set and a committee appointed, while it was decided that a grant should be made by the county to start the fund. A patriotic concert was held on December 9 at the Methodist Church, in aid of the fund, at which over 300 people were present. Mr. Patterson, K.C., and Mr. N. F. Davidson addressed the meeting, while patriotic songs completed the program.
