

UNDESIRABLES WHO CAME BACK INTERNED:

Men Weeded Out at Salisbury Are Trying to Secure Release.

Ottawa, Jan. 11.—Thirty men who professed to be Canadians, animated with a patriotic desire to serve their country, and who became enrolled in the first division, are now interned in different parts of the country. They are German suspects weeded out at Salisbury Plain by the Imperial authorities and sent back to Canada. The men are putting forth determined efforts to secure their freedom.

Applications to let out interned aliens are coming in in countless numbers, but the authorities are exercising great care. No one has been detained without evidence of his being a danger to the community, and good behavior or the recommendation of friends is not a reason for release.

The case of Dr. Kohman, of Toronto, is still under advisement. He is detained, but being a former German officer, secures the special treatment prescribed by the Hague convention.
