

LONDON TAKES STEPS TO GET CATTLE MARKET

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

London, Ont., Jan. 18.—London City Council to-night appointed a special committee to report upon the advisability of establishing a cattle market in the city. It was pointed out by a large and representative deputation that 60 per cent. of the live stock that goes to Toronto comes from western Ontario.

The Council decided to reduce the salaries of the members of the Board of Control from \$1,000 to \$500.

The Aldermen also decided to ask County Judge Macbeth to investigate the charges against H. J. Glaubitz, General Manager of the Public Utilities Commission, of aiding a German **reservist** to leave the country. This action had already been decided upon by the Utilities Commission, the City Council adding that the commission to pay the costs of the inquiry.
