The prisoners of war confined in Fort Henry are well looked after when they report any physical trouble. In the fort is a temporary hospital with twelve beds, with an experienced medical man in charge. Dr. R. J. Gardiner visits the fort every morning and prescribes for any prisoner who thinks he needs attention. There wre a few cases in the fort hospital, and one of cancer in the military hospital. The latter is a Turk and is not expected to recover. There is an Austrian who was placed in Rockwood Hespital some time ago. Two more Germans arrived from

Toronto on Tuesday.
