Prisoners of War. Ottawa, April 2.-The minister of

militia, Gen. Sam Hughes, has taken action on the evidence which has been brought out in the public accounts committee with regard to the purchase of binoculars. Today he suspended Lieut.-Col. Hurdman, inspector of technical equipment, pend-

ing further inquiry made as regarding his inspection of inferior binoculars, and the charge made by Mr. Bilsky, about "\$2 for incidentals" going to Colonel Hurdman for each of the glasses sold to the department by Bilsky and Birkett.

A return tabled in the commons today in regard to Canada's prisoners of war shows that up to Feb. 25 there had been 35,620 citizens of countries paroled in Canada, while the total number of prisoners of war was 2,294, interned in ten detention camps. The cost of the camps has totalled \$112,590, while relief granted to the families of interned prison
