

SHOT WHICH ENTERED HILLER HOME CAME FROM A DISTANCE

So Thinks Chief of Police,
Who Has Made Thorough
Investigation.

MILITIA IS NOT BLAMED FOR AFFAIR

Lt.-Col. Penhorwood, After
Careful Enquiry, Finds that
Soldiers are Blameless.

After making a careful canvass of the district the police have been unable to find anyone who heard the report of a shot on Monday afternoon at the time the bullet from a rifle entered the kitchen of the Hiller residence on Bay street. Chief Vincent is of the opinion that the shot was fired from some distance, and says that the explanation of the angle at which it entered the house is that the shot ricocheted.

Speaking to the Star Lieut.-Colonel Penhorwood said that the military authorities had made a careful examination and were of the opinion that the shot could not have been fired by a soldier. All the ammunition has been accounted for, he said, and the rifles examined. The inspection showed that they had not been discharged.
