

A GERMAN SUSPECT ARRESTED AT NAPANEE

**By Order of Col. Hemming—Had
Joined Mounted Rifles and
Was Discharged.**

Napanee, April 19.—Carl Keasler, thirty-five years of age, a German subject, was arrested at Napanee on Sunday by order of Col. T. D. R. Hemming, Kingston. To the police here he told a long rambling story of his having a farm in the west, and that he was married and his wife would not stay with him; also that he had worked at Sharbot Lake and that he was a shoemaker, and admitted that he had joined the Mounted Rifles from Kingston just recently. He said that he was discharged, came to Napanee on April 9th, and applied to Lieut. G. P. Reiffenstein to join the Fourth Contingent. He was passed, but nothing was seen of him since the 10th until Saturday, and he could not give any satisfactory account of his absence. His actions were suspicious, and upon information from Kingston he was placed under arrest by the local police and will be taken to Kingston to-day by Lieut. G. Stratton for examination.
