PROMISES TO BE HEAVY

Mr. H. H. Stevens, M. P., who has returned from an inspection of the alien detention camp at Vernon with Major Ridgway Wilson, of Victoria, said that everywhere the Okanagan country looks to be in fine shape, and that prospects for a big fruit crop there are excellent. Soaking rains have benefited the orchards and there is a great deal less unemployment there than in the winter. Mr. Stevens made no statement concerning the camp or the establishment of another, it being understood that he has made recommendations to Ottawa which will not be announced until the reply has been received.
