INTERNMENT OF All Germans in Canada Urged

OTTAWA, Ont., May 12 .-- German treachery, emphasized anew, by the sinking of the Lusitania, has brought forth a strong demand, from various parts of the country, for the internment of all Germans, regardless of whether they are naturalized or not. The authorities here are not disposed to go as far as that, but a close surveillance is being maintained and any suspicious individuals are being taken into custody. The situation is more especially acute on the Pacific Coast where yesterday, 181 Germans were interned in Vancouver and the surrounding district. Forty-five thousand alien enemies, eight thousand of whom are Germans, are now out on parole. While allowed their freedom, they are called upon to report regularly and establish their good conduct, to the registrars appointed for that purpose. Where there is any violation the parole is revoked and internment takes place. The number of Aliens now in the internment camps is 2800. Only about a fourth of them are Germans of German extraction. The latter developments abroad, including the sinking of the Lusitania tend to materially increase the internments and lead to more closer surveillance of those at large. So far however, it is not considered necessary to take into camp all Germans, including those who have citizenship by naturalization.

A London cable says: ---

Anti-German outbreaks of particular severity occurred to-day in the neighborhood of the East Indian docks. Sixty or seventy German shops were wrecked.

Germans in the vicinity are uniting for safe defence and police reinforcements are being rushed to the scene
