

ARMENIANS FOR FRONT FROM ST. CATHARINES

HAVE BEEN DRILLING FOR
MONTHS — FIFTY MORE
READY TO GO.

St. Catharines, May 24.—Six Armenians who have been drilling in the Armories here for the past several months left last night to join contingents of Armenians from other points in Canada and proceed to New York at the expense of the Armenian Association, to fight against the Turks. They will sail on a Russian-American Line steamer from New York, and proceed to Petrograd, from which point the Russian Government will provide free transportation to Persia. There are still fifty trained Armenians in St. Catharines ready to go to the front.

NORFOLK'S THIRD LOT.

Men Have Been Undergoing Strenuous Drill.

Simcoe, Ont., May 24.—The third contingent from Norfolk leaves tomorrow morning for Niagara, fifty strong, and a fine bunch of men, who have been undergoing a hard physical drill at the Armories here since last fall under the leadership of a qualified drill sergeant. There was a grand celebration at the Exhibition grounds this afternoon and another send-off with fireworks and speeches in the park to-night.
