PRISONERS IN THE FORT. Given Better Fare Than Canadian Soldiers In Camp. American Consul F. S. S. Johnson made a visit to Barriefield Camp on Sunday afternoon and declared that he has visited military camps in all parts of the world but this one in lay-out, cleanliness and general appearance was the best. He remarked that the Sunday supper of

the soldiers was not as good as that given the prisoners of war at Fort Henry. The soldiers received two pieces of broad, butter, Irish stew,

and a mug of coffee. The prisoners at the fort received four large pieces of bread, butter, iam, cheese

and tea.
