

Alien Enemies Find New Order

Days of McKenna Feebleness Give Place to Firm Policy

London, June 17.—Sir John Simon, the new Home Secretary, is showing strength in dealing with the enemy alien menace. Aliens are being interned as rapidly as camps can be provided. Applicants for exemptions must present a strong case before they have any chance of success. Of 2,160 such appeals, 618 are still under investigation, 1,256 have been refused, and 286 granted. The small number granted is sufficient proof that the days of McKenna feebleness are over. They have passed none too soon. The weakness of the Home Office under the last Secretary is surpassed by nothing in the record of the previous Government. Now that Sir John Simon is at the helm, the nation feels secure that everything possible is being done to protect it.
