

ALBERT RELEASED.

Edward Albert, the Welland upholsterer, who was detained by the military authorities last week, was released after he had been examined and his premises searched. It is gratifying to learn that Albert impressed his examiner as a man who attended strictly to his own business. It was revealed, too, that he had applied for citizenship papers to T. D. Cowper, county crown attorney, as long ago as 1911. Albert conducts an upholstering business in Welland and also one in Fort Erie, and his frequent absence from town created suspicion. These suspicions are now, however, apparently groundless.
