

MANY MISSING ALIENS MAY BE SEEKING WORK

**COL. GRASETT NOT DISPOSED TO
VIEW SITUATION WITH ALARM
—OFFICERS AT WORK.**

Chief Constable Grasett, the Registrar of Alien Enemies, states that of 3,386 alien enemies on the books turned over to him by the former registrar, 402 have failed to report as they had promised when they were paroled. Efforts are being made to obtain some trace of the missing foreigners, but plainclothesmen detailed to the work have not met with success.

Although the unsuccessful efforts of the police in rounding up the missing have been reported to Chief Constable Grasett, he does not view the situation seriously.

"In the majority of cases the men are ignorant laborers, who are continually moving about the Province, and think that once registered they do not need to report to the Registrar," said the Chief Constable, who, when asked concerning those who had reached border cities of the United States, added that he thought they had left Canada in search of work.
