

# ALIEN ENEMIES NOT EMPLOYED ON MUNITIONS WORK

Montreal, July 16.—F. A. Skelton, secretary-treasurer of the Canada Car and Foundry company, denies the statements made in the imperial House of Commons to the effect that the National Car company, of Hamilton, and the Canadian Car company, of Montreal, employed Germans and Austrians in the work of making munitions of war.

"The idea is ridiculous," said Mr. Skelton. "Why, one man, a neutral, just the other day expressed a slight sympathy for the enemy and there was an incipient riot about the place. He was run out of the plant at the lunch hour.

"As to the pay of the men," he added, "it is common knowledge that the men making war munitions are paid more than they were when they were building cars."
