

Armenians and Turks Used Knives Freely

Political Quarrel Ends in Wounding of Several at St. Catharines

St. Catharines, July 30.—A political quarrel in the Armenian quarter last night between two factions resulted in considerable blood being spilt, and A. Micallion, of Boston, agent of the Social Revolutionary Party, is locked up on a charge of carrying a revolver. Local police are having some difficulty in getting at the bottom of the affair. Several men were wounded. Micallion addressed an open air meeting last night in the interests of his party, whom the Social Democrats declare is in close touch with Turkey and cannot be trusted. The Social Democrats have paid the way to Petrograd of two quotas of Armenians who will fight with the Russian army against the Ottoman troops. In all 1,700 have been sent on this mission by the Social Democrats from the American continent. This fact the Social Democrats say this morning was denied by Micallion, and when they protested and accused the others of being in league with the Turkish party that early this month hanged their leader in Constantinople, trouble began. Soldiers and police were required to restore order. All of the wounded will recover.
