

Soldiers Aid In Harvests; Save Shortage of Help

There will be no shortage of harvest hands in Manitoba, according to Joseph Burke, provincial immigration officer. Mr. Burke admits, however, that there would have been a shortage were it not for the fact that many soldiers at Sewell, are now in the harvest fields.

Mr. Burke has sent out 7,000 men from Winnipeg to the farmers of the province and his agent at Sewell has found jobs for 1,000 soldiers. More than 3,000 aliens have received passports that they may work on farms during the next few weeks.

These soldiers have each been given a month's holiday and when they return to camp will be given full military pay for the time they were away, providing they can produce a certificate from the farmers they worked for.
