All in Canada Ordered Home in Message Received by Consul.

Montreal, Sept. 28.—All Greek reservists in Canada have been ordered home. The recall order reached the Greek Consul, J. C. Walsh, this morning from Athens.

SUMMONS FOR REEVE.

W. F. Appel Claims to be Able to Meet Charge of False Declaration.

Tavistock, Sept. 28.—William F. Appel, Reeve of Tavistock, and editor of The Tavistock Gazette, was to-day summoned to appear in the Police Court in Woodstock on Friday to face a charge of making false declaration of office. Reeve Appel, who is a native of Germany, denies the charge, which is laid by a member of the Town Council, and claims that he took the oath of allegiance years ago, although, through a technicality, documents of the proceedings never were made out.

ELORA WOMEN'S GIFTS.

Elora, Sept. 28.—The women of Elora and vicinity have during the year raised \$1,382.15, of which \$358 was given to the hospital ship and \$160 sent to the Canadian Red Cross Society, besides six shipments of hospital supplies valued at \$1,135.50, also \$78 for beds in the Queen's Military Hospital at Shorncliffe. For the relief of the Belgian and French war victims more than two tons of clothing was shipped, also a contribution of \$27.
