

LAND CLEARED BY ALIENS.

Northern Quebec and Ontario Camps Grow Vegetables.

Ottawa, Oct. 22.—Sir William Otter, who has returned from a visit of inspection to internment camps in northern Ontario and northern Quebec, is well pleased at the work done in clearing land. It has been demonstrated that there is good agricultural land. Vegetable crops were almost sufficient to keep the camps in supplies. Potatoes, however, rotted owing to the wet weather.

There are between six and seven thousand prisoners, and this number will shortly be augmented by the internment of a considerable number of Bulgarians. They are being registered. A new camp is being established at Banff for the winter, and the camp at Field, B.C., is being enlarged.
