

WOMAN SMUGGLED SAW INTO JAIL AT WINDSOR

Effort to Aid Escape of Respa, Who Is Suspected of Dynamite Outrage.

Windsor, Ont., Oct. 22.—Members of the Detroit "bomb band," of which Albert Kaltschmidt, a wealthy manufacturer, is the alleged leader, are said to be responsible for the hatching of the latest plot, recently uncovered, to liberate Charles Respa, a **German reservist** held on three charges of conspiracy and dynamiting buildings in Windsor and Walkerville. Spirited from the Sandwich jail by Governor John Harmon shortly after the discovery of the plot to free him, the present whereabouts of Respa remains a secret.

The cell formerly occupied by Respa is on the east side of the jail, and the prisoner frequently hung his coat over the bars, presumably to keep out the sun while he slept. It was discovered Thursday that the man took this means to cover up his operations and had sawed through bars of the cell. The saw has been found, and it is said it was smuggled into the cell by a female relative of a man now interned in Kingston for complicity in the wrecking of the Nepigon bridge, in a basket of fruit and food.

The dismissal of the turnkey, who was supposed to examine the contents of all baskets, has been announced.
