peing questioned at central station. Kupczanko was known in Minnapolis as Alexander Apie. He lived at 210 Fourteenth avenue south. His friends old the police he fled from Canada after being interned by the Canadian government there, and that he took an

assumed name to avoid detection. From information gahtered by deteclives during the night, the police have learned that Kupczanko met the two men who killed him early in the after-

noon, and together the three made the ounds of the saloons in the gateway district.

Kupczanko was taken to the city hospital, where he gave details of the robbery and the shooting. He said the two men shot him when he resisted their efforts to rob him, and that they took \$65 from his pockets as he lay on the ground mortally wounded. He was unable to give the detectives a

description of the assailants.
