

Police Court News

Six drunks were on the police court docket Tuesday, most of them contributing their mite towards the maintenance of the city police.

Max Wenzell, a naturalized German, was placed in the dock to receive sentence for carrying a revolver under circumstances already reported. Deputy Magistrate Browning pointed out to the accused that he was liable to a penalty of \$100 or three months' imprisonment, or to both. It was a most serious offense, but he was inclined to believe the story that the accused was on his way to a second-hand dealer's store to get rid of the weapon. He did not intend to fine him, for that would mean that after paying the fine, the law could no longer touch him, but he intended to remand him for sentence. This would mean that if he ever misbehaved, he could be arrested again on the same charge and punished by the court.
