

WERNER HORN'S APPEAL.

Date for Hearing May Be Assigned
Next Week.

Boston, Jan. 6.—The question of fixing a date for hearing the appeal in habeas corpus proceedings filed by Werner Horn, arrested last February after he had attempted to blow up the international railroad bridge at Vanceboro, Me., and later indicted on a charge of transporting dynamite in violation of the interstate commerce laws, came up in the United States Circuit Court of Appeals yesterday, but no assignment was made. Horn claimed that he was a German army officer, and that his attempt to destroy the bridge was an act of war.

Judge Putnam, who is presiding, said he did not think it was proper for him to sit in the case, as he had heard part of it when it first reached the Federal Court. Judge Dodge is expected to assign the case next week.
